"Family Drama: Favotitism" (Genesis 25:21-24: Pew Bible No. 38 Rev. Dr. Jeremy Shoulta

Isaac prayed to the LORD for his wife, since she was unable to have children. The LORD was moved by his prayer, and his wife Rebekah became pregnant. But the boys pushed against each other inside of her, and she said, "If this is what it's like, why did it happen to me?" So she went and asked the LORD.
